Welcome to all the Nursery parents and children. The children have begun settling really well into Nursery, and are exploring the areas of provision and making new friends. So that we find out more about our Nursery children, the first topic will be 'All About Me' where we will be finding out about the children's favourite things, talking about who is in their family, painting pictures of themselves or family members and finding out about likes and dislikes. In Literacy children will be listening to stories with a familiar setting and will be writing about what they like to do with their family and friends. Reception News



Year 1 News

Welcome to all the Reception parents and children. The children have settled extremely well into the Reception routine and have enjoyed playing in the areas of provision. This term the topic will be 'My Family'. We will be talking about who is in their family, painting self-portraits and drawing and labelling pictures of their family. In Literacy the children will be listening to different stories all about families and completing a piece of writing all about themselves. In Maths the children will be learning all about friendship and ways in which they can be a good friend. We will be sharing Bible stories all about friendship and talking about who our friends are. We will be doing PE on a Friday. Please ensure that they have a white t-shirt, black shorts and pumps or trainers in a bag labelled with their name on it. Please check your child has their name written in all items of school clothing including their coat. If you have any questions please come and see a member of staff in Reception. We are always happy to talk to you in the morning or at the end of the day.

Welcome to Year 1! We hope everybody has had a lovely summer break. The children have started Year 1 with a positive attitude and have quickly settled into their new routines. They seem excited and eager to learn lots of new and interesting things and hopefully this enthusiasm will continue! As part of our Geography subject the children will be focusing on weather and the different seasons of the year. So far the children have greatly enjoyed observing, discussing and predicting different types of weather. In Art we will be looking at the life and work of Gustav Klimt and the many famous paintings, patterns and drawings that he created. The children will critique his work and will also be attempting their own art work in the style of Klimt. The children will soon all receive a new reading book; we would therefore like to ask that they bring their reading books into school every day. They will read in school with an adult 1:1, once a week, and will also have their books changed. Online homework will also be assigned on Fridays and is to be completed and returned by the following Wednesday. We will also be regularly sending home Learning Log challenges. Both Year 1 classes have PE three times a week; therefore we suggest that your child leaves their PE kit in school for the half term to ensure they have their full kit for their PE sessions. If you have any questions please feel free to ask a member of the Year 1 team.

Hello and welcome to all the parents and carers to Year 2. We hope you have had a relaxing summer and enjoyed the time with your children. We can tell from some of the stories the children have relayed back to members of staff that they have done some fun things over the summer holidays. We have an amazing first half term. In maths children will be learning about place value, number bonds and number sequences. We will also be focusing on story writing in English, concentrating on familiar settings using exciting vocabulary. Our History topic this term is Up, Up and Away, where we will be learning about the first flight and how aeroplanes have changed our lives. In Science our topic this term is about life cycles and how to look after not just ourselves but our pets. PE will take place three times a week, so please make sure your child has a full PE kit every day. We are looking forward to working with you and your children.

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Year 3 News

Welcome back to school for our first autumn half term, and welcome to Key Stage 2! We have a busy, fun half term planned! In Maths, we will be developing our understanding of the four number operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Some other topics we will look at are: shape, place value and money. In English, we will be looking at the story 'I'll take you to Mrs Cole' and writing our own versions of the story. We will then be looking at writing instructions and Roman myths. Our Science theme is Rocks! We will be learning about the different types of rocks and how they are made. We will then be going back millions of years to find out how fossils are formed. Finally, we will look at soil, asking the question - what on Earth is it? Our Geography topic is called, 'Where on Earth are we?' and we will be creating our own world games, learning about the continents and oceans and time zones! Now we are in KS2 the class will be learning French! This term we will learn some classroom phrases, numbers, French songs and lots more. In Art, we will be focusing on the artist Vincent Van Gogh and the skill of drawing. In Design and Technology we will be designing and making our own photo frames! Computing will see us becoming programmers!

Hello to all children parents and carers and welcome to Year 4! We are all refreshed and raring to start new challenging Year 4 themes and topics. In class we have already been hearing about the interesting things the children have been doing in the holidays. We hope you all enjoyed the time with your children. The Year 4 team this year has a new member of staff - we welcome Mr Murray and hope he enjoys his time at St Peter's. Mrs Cavill is teaching the other Year 4 class and Mrs Hughes, Mrs Brewer and Mrs Asghar, complete the Year 4 team. Back to school, back to work! In English we are looking at the antics of the infamous Horrid Henry. He is a great character to study! In Maths we continue to stretch and challenge the children encouraging them to be able to explain HOW they have found an answer not just to write it. You should already have received a letter about our exciting trip to Chester. This supports our learning about the Romans and the impact they had on our lives today. The children will experience life as a Roman in the Dewa museum and even do some marching with a real Roman soldier! In Science we are studying a chemistry unit looking at the States of Matter.

Welcome back to another school year. We hope you had a great summer and are rested and ready to learn lots in this busy year. We have an exciting year planned. In English we are focusing on the Jungle Book, looking in detail at the characters and Kipling's style of writing. For Maths we will be starting by exploring place value and addition with a particular interest in the decimal places. In science we are beginning to look at life cycles. The learning logs for this year will be focused around our foundation topics; Geography, History, RE, Art, DT, Music and PE. In Geography we are opening with the Amazon where we will be learning about the countries around it and the people of it. In RE we are focusing on the Bible and why it is important to Christians. In Art we will be looking at Cezanne's artwork and life and we will be having fun in DT exploring moving mechanisms.



Year 6 News



Welcome back after the summer holidays. This is the beginning of an extremely exciting year for all the children in Year 6! Over the course of this half term the children will be learning lots of new and invigorating things across the curriculum. In English, children will be focussing on different genres of writing where they have the opportunity to edit and redraft their work; ensuring each piece of writing shows their true potential. In Maths we are consolidating the 4 rules of number, extending the children's knowledge to ensure they are able to apply this in all contexts. In RE we will be learning all about 'Life as a Journey' – looking at the journeys of religious icons, as well as the journeys of other influential people in our lives. This will give us an insight into how life has many twists and turns along the path to our future. We will be participating in Crucial Crew where the children will learn about how to stay safe in the local area when they are independent. This will take place on the 6th October and we are sure the children will enjoy it.
