These clubs promote being active, provide a range of sports and dance opportunities and also encourage healthy eating. The PE co-ordinator and After school clubs co-ordinator have regular meetings with management to ensure that the clubs are fulfilling their potential and have enough attendees. We also welcome feedback from the children at St Peters to inform us about what clubs we may want to offer in the future. We will continue to bring new ideas of keeping fit into St Peters to ensure that children remain motivated and interested in keeping fit.
